AmeriCorps Position Description: Youth and Families Services Coordinator

AmeriCorps is your moment to take the path less traveled, to break the status quo, to stop talking about the problem and be the solution.

Epilepsy Foundation New England helps people and families affected by epilepsy. Epilepsy is a neurological disorder that is characterized by electrical discharges in the brain that cause seizures. Epilepsy has many faces, from onset in early life to older adulthood, from people who are very disabled to very high functioning, and from seizure types that range from staring spells to convulsions. 1 in 26 people develop epilepsy in their lifetime. Young people with epilepsy are at high risk for poor socioemotional and health outcomes as they work to transition to adulthood with an often unpredictable disease that is poorly understood by society and may be isolating. YOU can make a difference in the healthy futures of children and youth.

AmeriCorps members with Epilepsy Foundation New England will serve 10.5 months in a full-time capacity. What they have in common is a desire to put their talents and ideas to use in the service of their communities

The Foundation's 14 AmeriCorps Youth and Families Services Coordinators will be instrumental in:

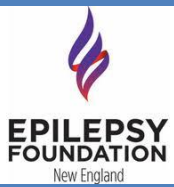
- Starting and Managing a Young Leaders Network to mentor and engage high school and college aged youth in community service, leadership, and advocacy as well as community building.
- Starting and Managing a Kids Connect Network to mentor and engage middle school aged youth in skill-building and community building.
- Facilitating parent support groups.
- Providing educational workshops to students and school personnel.
- Recruiting volunteers to serve with the Members to support these efforts.

Members will use the Foundation's curricula and program guides to implement these services and will receive high quality training and support for success.

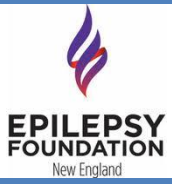
Required

- Legal authorization to work in the United States
- 18 years of age or older
- Experience with or interest in volunteerism and community engagement
- Ability to balance service commitment with other family/work/school/community commitments in a sustainable way
- Strong communication skills
- Ability to attend to detail with accuracy while not losing sight of the bigger picture
- Strong time management, project management, and organizational skills
- Ability and desire to work in a fast-paced, entrepreneurial, team-oriented culture and deadline- sensitive environment
- Flexibility, grace under pressure, ability to make strong rational decisions, and a sense of humor

Preferred

- Demonstrable commitment to people with disabilities and/or epilepsy specifically
- Experience as a volunteer (in any capacity).
